Chair Tsernoglou,

We write to express our support for House Bill 4210, which will benefit our military service members' ability to exercise their right to vote by allowing electronic voting to meet the unique needs of active-duty military family members overseas.

There is a long history of service members participating in elections by casting absentee ballots. According to the National Postal Museum, members of the military voted absentee as early as the War of 1812. Union troops in the Civil War were the first group in American history to vote by mail in significant numbers.

Federal law requires states to provide special voting rights for service members stationed away from home. Since 2009, states have also been required to provide electronic transmission options for blank ballots, but at least 30 states require most overseas voters to mail their completed ballots back.

We count on our service members to defend our nation, so we owe it to them to count their ballots. We need to ensure our service members and their families are allowed to participate in our elections, no matter where in the world they are. We the undersigned thus ask that you support and pass this legislation so that Michigan's military families have greater options to vote while serving their country.
